Why does inclusive communication matter for LGBTIQ+ clients?

- LGBTIQ+ inclusivity means acknowledging and respecting diversity
- Not just language meaningful engagement requires understanding
- Making assumptions can have a negative impact
- Can reduce stress, anger, fear of poor treatment, and a fear of rejection
- Reduce people delaying seeking help
- Disclosure is important
- Impacts engagement with education and health



What works to ensure inclusive communication with LGBTIQ+ clients?

- LGBTIQ+ people are not homogenous: follow a client-centred approach
- Affirmative approach
 - Understand and be proactive
- Beyond assumptions

There is a young person in the waiting room to see you

- Competence with language
 - Demonstrate comfort using inclusive language and LGBTIQ+ terms
 - Willingness to let clients be themselves and use their chosen terms





Using evidence for decision making: for practitioners

- Communicate in a way that welcomes LGBTIQ+ clients
- Take the lead from clients
- Learn common terms
- Signal inclusivity to all clients
- Participate in training
- Research information about specialist services for LGBTIQ+ care



Using evidence for decision making: for organisations


- Update content to ensure it is inclusive
- Develop inclusive registration forms and privacy protocols
