Over the next two years, the NSW Government, in partnership with key stakeholders, will deliver a broad range of initiatives. From the NSW Seniors Card, which helps seniors with cost-of-living pressures, to the Connecting Seniors Grant Program, which aims to reduce social isolation, we are committed to enhancing the lives of seniors across NSW. Promoting the wellbeing of seniors is not only important for older people, the benefits are far reaching also positively impacting their families and the boarder community.

Who are seniors?

Seniors today come from many different backgrounds, including various genders, cultures, languages, and abilities.

In NSW, people are considered seniors starting at age 60, or at age 50 for First Nations peoples.

It's important to understand that seniors are not all the same. How they age and what they expect from ageing can be affected by many things. Also, the needs and goals of people over 65, over 75, and over 85 can be very different.

It outlines the wide range of services, supports and initiatives provided by the NSW Government in partnership with the community to promote the health and wellbeing of older people.

The actions in the Plan reflect the diversity of older people across the State and the NSW Government's emphasis on reaching marginalised communities, including:

- First Nations peoples aged 50 years and over
- people from multicultural communities
- lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex or queer individuals
- people living with disability, dementia, chronic disease or mental illness
- carers
- those living in rural and remote areas.

Social isolation is a significant issue for many seniors, particularly for those living alone or in rural and remote areas. Many also face challenges like cost-of-living pressures, housing insecurity or elder abuse.

The actions in this plan aim to create opportunities for seniors, particularly vulnerable older people, to fully participate in their communities. A range of innovative initiatives are being delivered to breakdown barriers to accessing key services and supports so that all older people are connected, included and can enjoy happier, healthier lives.

Installed fire safety systems such as smoke alarms and Emergency Warning and Intercommunication System (EWIS) within multi-level residential buildings are designed to notify the occupants of the building of a fire and the need to either get ready to evacuate or evacuate the building. They use alarm tones that may, however, be inaudible to a person who is deaf or hard of hearing.

Fire and Rescue NSW statistics reveal that people aged 65 and over are the highest fire fatality risk group in the community.

The ability to connect an accessory that provides a visual and vibrating alert would improve the life safety of older people and occupants with a disability.







NSW legislation requires that every home has smoke alarms installed in accordance with the Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021.

Nearly 50% of house fire fatalities are aged 65 years and over. People who are deaf or hard of hearing or who use hearing aids and remove them of a night to sleep are unable to hear alerts from smoke alarms. Access to a funded deaf or hard of hearing smoke alarms that have a visual and vibrating alert is dependent upon the resident having access to either NDIS or My Aged Care. Those who don't meet these criteria are unable to access funded or subsidised smoke alarms leading to an inequity of access for those who are deaf or hard of hearing.

Fire and Rescue NSW partially addresses the gap through supplying limited numbers of deaf or hard of hearing smoke alarms as part of their Safety Visit program.

The program helps people live more safely and confidently in their home in areas where bush fires may start. AIDER services can include clearing gutters, thinning vegetation around the home, removing leaf and tree debris, mowing or slashing long grass.

The expanded Program will also offer Home Fire Safety Visits. This will involve discussing home fire safety with residents, offering simple home fire safety advice, and testing and replacing smoke alarms if needed.


