




Family Preservation Recommissioning Update

- Permanency Support Program (PSP) Family Preservation.






DCJ Updates

infoShare update



- Quarter 1 (July September) data submission now overdue (31 October 2024).
- infoShare reports including the Family Preservation Program -Organisation Service delivery Report, is now live. This tool will assist with monitoring and review of data submission for providers as well as DCJ Contract Managers.
- Extension requests for data submission are to be made in the first instance to your DCJ Contract Manager. This request is assessed as outlined in the Family Preservation Data Collection infoShare Platform Business Rules for External Family Preservation Service Providers December 2023, noting extensions are to be requested three weeks prior to the deadline and in the event of "exceptional circumstances".

Interim Changes to Assessing Risk in Child Protection

Interim approach to assessing risk in Child Protection



- The interim approach to assessing risk in child protection commenced 12 September 2024 with a 60-day grace period.
- As of 11 November 2024, risk assessments will no longer be available for use by DCJ caseworkers.
